Additional Updates

Gas Detectors (Local Law 157): Gas detector installation will be installed on the following dates: **Building B**, September 30th; **Building C**, October 7th; **Building D**, October 14th.

Lighting Upgrade (Local Law 88): Will proceed with installation of energy-efficient lighting solutions like LEDs, daylight controls, and occupancy sensors in specifically defined public spaces after recommendations are finalized. Installation is expected to be completed by December 2025.

Proactive Lead-based Paint Testing (Local Law 111): X-ray fluorescence (XRF) testing has been completed in specifically defined public spaces within all 4 buildings. This project is in progress.

Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reduction (Local Law 97): Hampton Court's original square footage was improperly recorded and has been resubmitted with a substantial increase in square footage, which lowers greenhouse gas emissions per square foot. All required filings have been completed.

Benchmarking Law (Local Law 84): This updated local law (from 2009) requires buildings to submit their annual energy use to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Deadline extended to August 29, 2025. Filing was sent.

Window Renovation: Management submitted a proposal. If shareholders are interested in window replacement please contact Property Manager Kimmarie Mealer kimmarie.mealer@fsresidential.com and cc the Board HamptonCourtWeb@gmail.com for any additional information or concerns.

Dual-Plunger Brake System for Our Elevators

In New York City, all existing elevators with single-plunger brakes must be upgraded by January 1, 2027 to comply with new Department of Buildings (DOB) code requirements of a dual-plunger brake system.

Unfortunately, our elevators are not in compliance with this new code and require upgrades to meet it. The Board is in consultation with field experts to evaluate the most cost effective method of handling this project. Based on our initial findings, an assessment will be likely required to cover this cost.

The safety, legal compliance, and long-term value of our buildings remain the Boards top priorities. Once our evaluation is complete and we consult with Legal and Management, we will hold a special meeting with shareholders to discuss the work that will be done and the associated cost. Compost Drop-Off on Sundays

Compost drop-off takes place ONLY on Sundays from 10am-2pm, located in the courtyard between A & B buildings. Please ensure the following:

- Do NOT fill compost bins past the 3/4 full line marked with tape
- Do NOT push compost down; once it reaches the 3/4 full line, move on to the next bin

Proper composting actually DECREASES pest outbreaks as it keeps food waste out of our garbage chutes, where the roaches like to nest. Ideally, compost should be kept frozen in BPI Certified compostable bags. This reduces waste, spills, & smells. Thank you for your continued cooperation and support!

Proper Trash Chute Use

When using the garbage chute, please remember:

- Always bag and tie your trash securely using a sturdy garbage bag.
 Flimsy bags easily tear and spill contents everywhere
- · Never toss loose, unbagged food scraps
- · Never put glass down the chute

These three simple rules make a big difference. Unbagged trash or flimsy bags can burst open on the way down, creating a mess that our porters must clean **by hand**. Food scraps attract pests (like the cockroaches we're currently dealing with), and broken glass can cause serious injuries to the staff who handle our garbage.

Let's all work together to ensure that every member of our community keep our Hampton Court safe and pleasant for every resident and every member of our staff.
